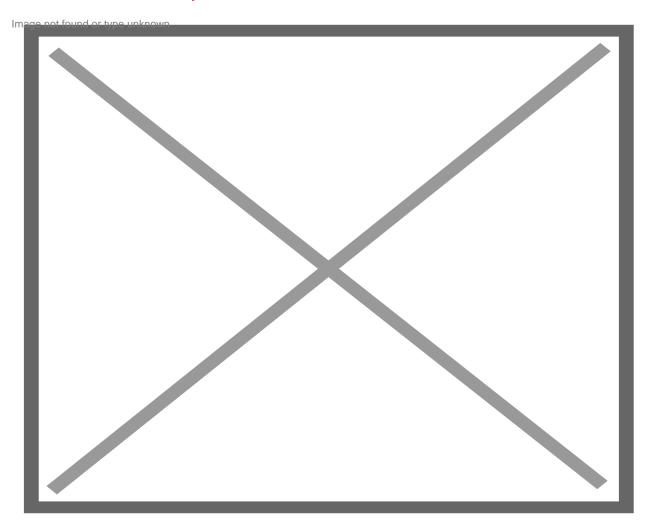
UVI Names Dr. Suzanne Darrow-Magras as New UVI CELL Director
