This year's fair, under the theme "Agriculture: Our future and so much more in 2024", promises an array of activities and exhibitions celebrating the territory's agricultural heritage and future.

The fair, open to the public, will charge an entrance fee of \$6 for adults, \$4 for children, and \$5 for senior citizens. It will operate daily from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., with the opening ceremonies set for 10 a.m. on Saturday, February 17.

Petersen, commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and president of the Agriculture and Food Fair Board.

The event promises family fun with exhibits, demonstrations, entertainment, and competitions. The fair will also host participants from Guyana, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, and Grenada, showcasing a regional collaboration in agriculture.
