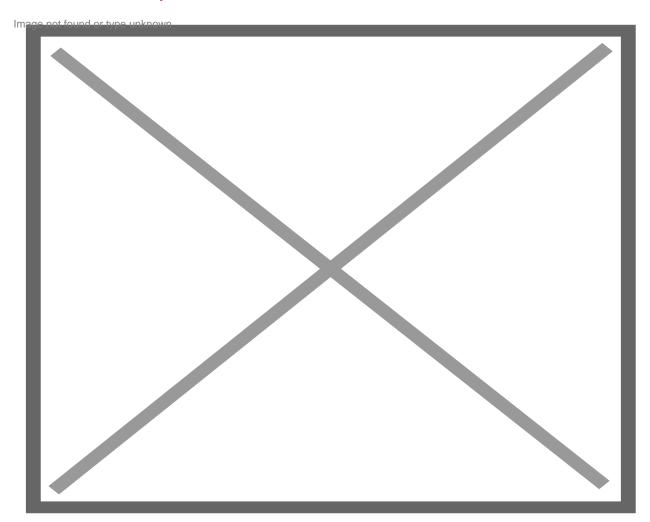
Guardian Insurance Donates 5,000 Masks to Dept. of Health and VIPD
