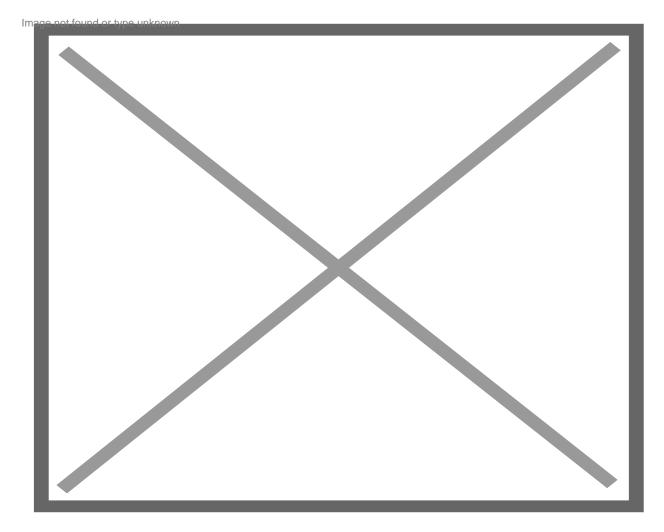
## Virgin Islander Warren Wells Among Elite Group Inducted Into Delta's Chairman's Club

Virgin Islander and Delta Air Lines veteran of 21 years, Warren Wells Jr., joined an elite class of 100 colleagues hailing from stations across the United States and four countries, according to a release issued Thursday. annual Chairman's Club Gala in Atlanta, Georgia. Each inductee was honored with a 10-carat gold Chairman's Club lapel pin, two confirmed tickets anywhere in the world Delta flies, and Tumi luggage. Mr. Wells along with the inductees will also travel to France in 2020 to bring back a new aircraft to the United States.

Mr. Well expressed gratitude for the honor. "This honor embodies service which I feel comes naturally for me. As I see a need, I fill the need. I am truly humbled to have been recognized," he said.

Mr. Wells, who hails from St. John, began his career with Delta Airlines in 1998 as a ramp agent, and has risen through the ranks to his current role. In his present capacity, he is responsible for managing the busiest concourse at the world's busiest airport: Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport. He is a 1987 graduate of Charlotte Amalie High School, and earned his master's degree from Tuskegee University in 2013. He is the son of Warren Wells, Sr. and Yvonne Wells of St. John.
