

"Bob Marley: One Love" Leads Box Office with Record-Breaking Debut

This weekend the box office was dominated by "Bob Marley: One Love," a biopic celebrating the life and legacy of the iconic reggae musician Bob Marley. The film outperformed its competitors, notably "Madame Web," a Marvel movie that has received critical panning.

"Bob Marley: One Love" garnered impressive sales, pulling in \$12 million on Valentine's Day alone, marking it as the strongest Valentine's Day midweek release since "The Vow" in 2012. Financially, "Bob Marley: One Love" has made a notable impact, with domestic cumulative box office records indicating a gross of over \$25 million. The international response, while still rolling out, adds to the film's overall success. T
