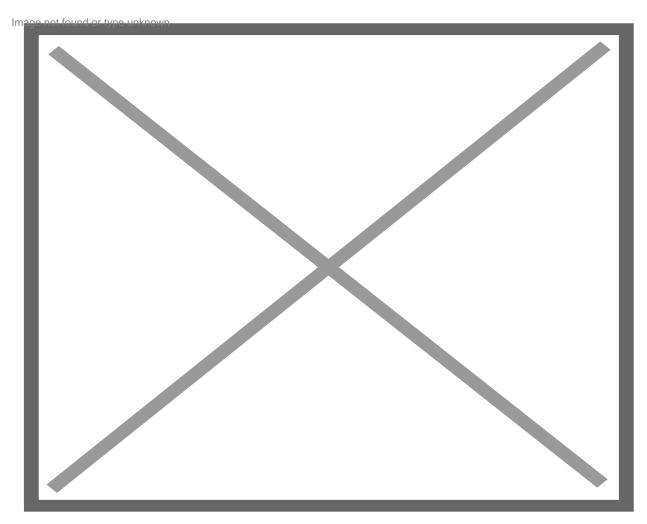
JFL COO to Serve as Interim CEO Amid Search for Permanent Leader
