As part of the University of the Virgin Islands' 2024 Homecoming celebration, the Reichhold Center of the Arts (RCA) and UVI President Dr. Safiya George are inviting the community to "Sessions on the Floor," a free musical concert set for Saturday, November 2.

RCA Sessions is a concert series that exclusively spotlights local Virgin Islands talent, taking place in various settings while the Reichhold Center for the Arts undergoes reconstruction. Denise Humphrey, RCA's Director, expressed her enthusiasm about the concert lineup, noting, "We are excited to bring together such a diverse group of local performers to create a one-of-a-kind concert that will surprise and delight."
