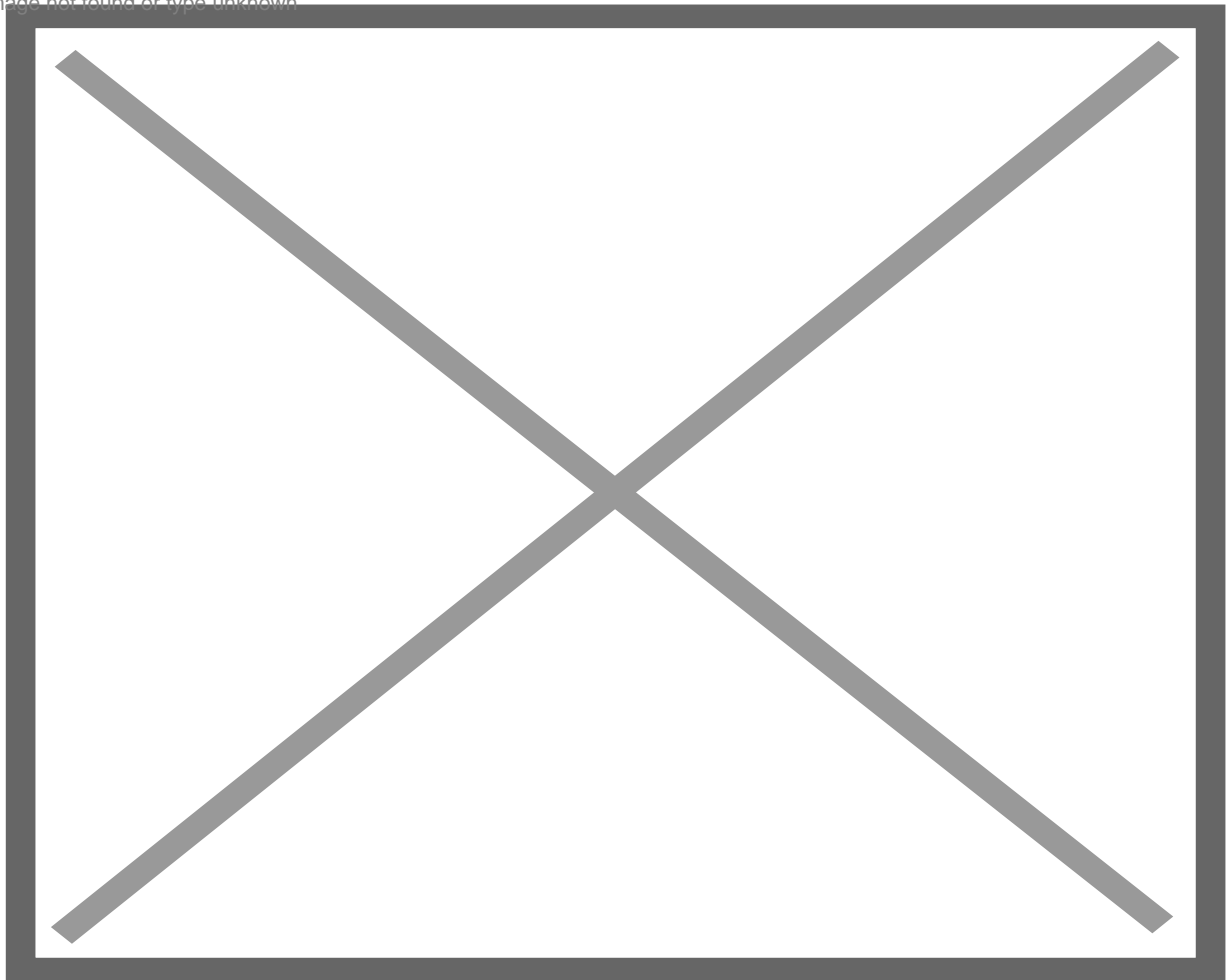
Watch: Coquito Festival, Foreday Morning Tramp and Horse Racing Energize USVI
