
James Patterson Foundation Donates \$75,000 to UVI for Aspiring Writers

The Patterson Family Foundation has presented the University of the Virgin Islands with a \$75,000 gift intended to be used to support first-year undergraduate and graduate students aspiring to careers in writing or the teaching of writing.

The foundation, established by acclaimed author James Patterson, annually funds scholarships at several tertiary institutions include Vanderbilt University and Manhattan College among others. Now, UVI joins the list, with the ability to award 10 scholarships worth \$7500 each to aspiring writers embarking on their academic journeys. The scholarships are meant to help equip their recipients with the resources necessary to succeed in their chosen endeavor.

"This gift is a testament to the Foundation's commitment to literacy, education, and the power of storytelling," said UVI President Dr. Safiya George. These values "align seamlessly with UVI's mission to inspire and empower the next generation of leaders," she continued.
