Logan Cruz was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia at just seven months old. He battled bravely for nearly three years before passing away just short of his third birthday. “My name is Anais Cruz, and I am the proud founder and chairwoman of the Logan Miracle Foundation, a mission born from the heart-wrenching journey of my son,” Cruz shared. “His brave fight inspired many across the U.S. Virgin Islands and beyond. Tragically, Logan passed away just shy of his third birthday, but his spirit, courage, and light continue to guide us.”

To celebrate “Logan Cruz the Superhero Day” and raise awareness for childhood cancer, the Logan Miracle Foundation has partnered with the Department of Education to launch a unique territory-wide event. On May 13, elementary school students across St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John are invited to wear superhero capes to school, symbolizing the bravery of children fighting cancer.

“This is more than a celebration — it’s a call to action,” said Cruz. “We ask the entire community to stand with us in spreading awareness about childhood cancer and to help us honor Logan’s memory with love, unity, and hope.”

Leading up to the main celebration, the foundation is hosting a family-friendly event at the Sunny Isle Amphitheater on Saturday, May 10, from 12 PM to 3 PM. The community is invited to attend and collect superhero capes for their children.

The day will include:

- Face painting by Artistador Arts and Communications
- Photo ops with “Superhero Logan”
- Music, Oreos, sweet treats, and more
