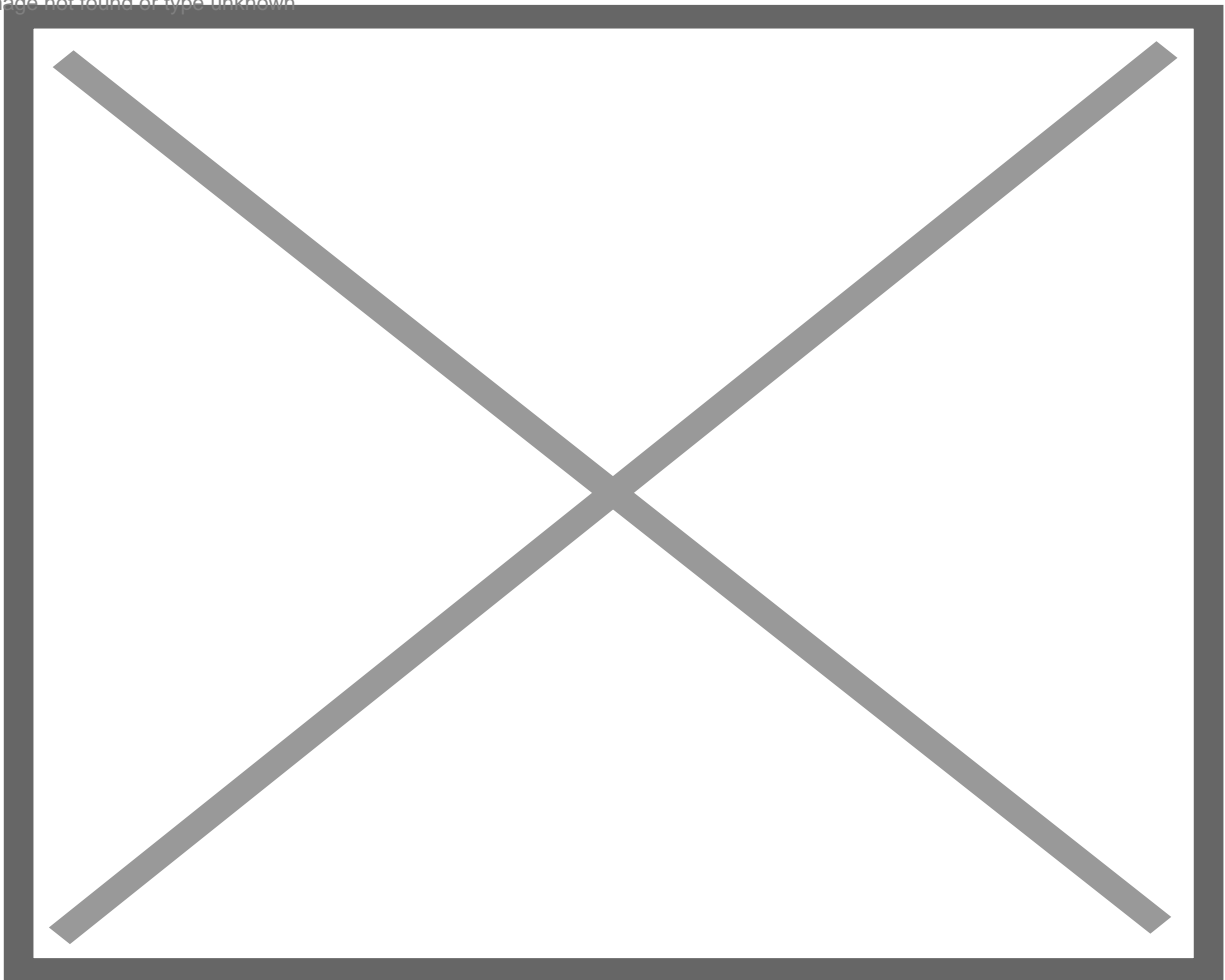
## Watch: Scenes of Boat Parade 2025 on St. Croix
