USVI Music Festival Set For St. Thomas

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Music will be in the air in the United States Virgin Islands this summer.

ST. THOMAS -- On the heels of the St. John Festival carnival celebration to be held over the July 4th holiday weekend, its sister island, St. Thomas, will be hosting America's Paradise USVI Music Festival, featuring top tier musicians and entertainers from July 16 to 19, according to a press release Dept. of Tourism issued on Thursday.

The summer festival features the likes of Barrington Levy, Destra, Don Omar, Third World, Cedric The Entertainer, Future, and the Virgin Islands' own reggae superstar Pressure Busspipe.

"Special events such as Music Fest help to drive business throughout the summer months," said Tourism Commissioner Beverly Nicholson-Doty. "We are looking forward to, not only enjoying some great music and entertainment, but also welcoming many

visitors and festival goers to Charlotte Amalie next month."
