St. Thomas Arrests: July 23-26

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VIPD Public Information Officer Kevin Jackson announced the following arrests on St. Thomas from July 23-26.

Thursday, July 23, 2015 - Brittany Elizabeth Ganson, 35 of Mahogany Run was arrested and charged with driving under the influence at 10:30 p.m. on St. Peter Mountain Road. Bail for Ganson was set at \$1,500.

Unable to make bail of \$25,000, Joseph was remanded to the
