THOMAS -- Acting Commissioner of the Department of Planning and Natural Resources (DPNR), Dawn Henry, is advising residents here that the department will embark on a joint effort with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to attempt to resolve the foul odor in the Red Hook area, according to a press release issued on Tuesday.

The effort will include, but not limited to, air and water sampling, the release stated. Today, representatives from DPNR and EPA will canvass the Red Hook area to conduct surveys from residents and the business community who may have been impacted by this smell.
