Potter To Residents: September 30 Is Property Tax Deadline

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Lieutenant Governor Osbert Potter on Thursday reminded residents that the 2016 property tax bills that have been issued to all property owners on record as of January 1, 2016, will become delinquent if not paid by September 30 -- seven days away.

According to the release, property tax bills may be paid online at the Office of the Lieutenant Governor's website [here](#). However, payment plans must still be made through the Virgin Islands Tax Collector.

Consistent with past billings, the 2016 bill also includes information on unpaid tax years. Property owners who have not paid their prior tax year bills are encouraged to contact

the Virgin Islands Tax Collector to make arrangements for payment.
