ATF Agents Arrest St. Thomas Man For Possessing Crack With Intent To Distribute

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ST. THOMAS -- Tolomah Foy, 23, of St. Thomas made his initial appearance on Monday before U.S. Magistrate Judge Ruth Miller after being charged with possession with intent to distribute approximately 29 grams of crack cocaine, United States Attorney Ronald W. Sharpe announced.

Judge Miller released Foy on a \$10,000 unsecured bond and set Foy's preliminary hearing for December 14, 2016.

According to the complaint, on December 10, 2016, agents of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) arrested the defendant in the Red Hook area

of St. Thomas after agents made several purchases of crack cocaine from the defendant.

Under federal law if convicted of possession with intent to distribute 28 grams or more of crack cocaine, Foy faces a minimum of five years in prison and a maximum fine of \$5,000,000. This case is being investigated by the ATF. It is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Everard Potter.

United States Attorney Sharpe reminds the public that a complaint is merely a formal charging document and is not evidence of guilt. Every defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

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
