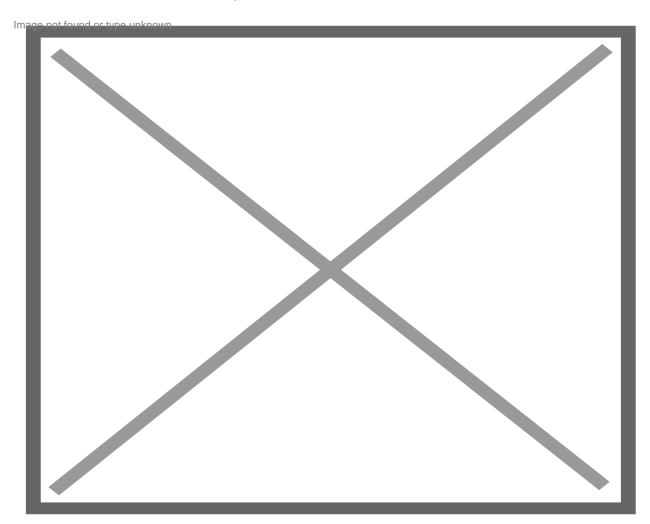
U.S. Virgin Islands Named Destination of the Year by Leading Caribbean Travel Online Magazine

The U.S. Virgin Islands has received the "Destination of the Year" award from Caribbean Journal, a digital Caribbean travel news publication.

The USVI captured the top spot in the 7th edition of the "Caribbean Travel Awards", while The Ritz-Carlton St. Thomas was named "Caribbean Hotel of the Year".

The luxury resort, which reopened in November 2019 following a period of extensive enhancements after the 2017 hurricanes, was recognized for its continued high level of service despite the challenges presented by the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. It was also lauded by Caribbean Journal's editors for "setting a new standard for health, safety and

Caribbean hospitality in the process."
