

ST. CROIX — Art educators, art appreciators, and community activists attended last weekend's opening exhibit of <u>Youth Art Month</u> (YAM) on St. Croix at Crucian Heritage and Nature Tourism (C.H.A.N.T.). Artwork was displayed on the walls and columns, on the staircases, and some even hung from the ceiling.

"At tonight's opening exhibit on St. Croix, I felt the love, the magic, and the creativity of our young people. I was most amazed at the coming together of art educators and activists who ensured that our youth have opportunities to be celebrated and honored. This is critical to the strengthening of our community. They are our most important investment for our future," shared

Jedaya George and Normaris Perez of Central High School create handmade jewelry together from wire, beads, washers, and gears since they were bored during the pandemic, they said. They wanted to do something safe, so they brainstormed what they were good at and decided on jewelry making. Both young ladies sing, play the flute in the school band, and draw. Thus far, they've made over 22 pieces of jewelry and sell their pieces at the Saturday morning market at the Department of Agriculture fair grounds. These young entrepreneurs are working towards selling on Instagram under their business name <u>'Creative Expressions'</u>.

Comic book author Karim Callwood from St. Thomas came over to sell his comic books, t-shirts, and gave away coloring pages and posters to parents and children present featuring VI Guardian Alpha. His comic book tells the story of a local superhero with Superman-like abilities who tries to help the Virgin Islands by warding off enemies whose commit crimes that often get covered up. The stories are related to what is typically experienced in the territory, he shared in interview with VIC.

Juju and Cece's Lemonades sponsored their delicious, locally made lemonades for the evening and shared that a portion of each sale goes towards Project Promise VI, a nonprofit organization that caters to the needs of at-risk youth in the territory.
