
Melinda Charles Receives Eagle Rising Award

Chief Warrant Officer 2 Melinda Charles on Saturday received the Eagle Rising Award for her leadership and dedication contributed to Virgin Islands National Guard Association, the V.I. National Guard made known Sunday.

Ms. Charles was recognized for her outstanding service and contributions while serving as a member of the Virgin Islands National Guard Association's Membership Committee. She was instrumental in the association achieving 100 percent membership for seven consecutive years. Awarded to only Warrant Officers, the Eagle Rising Award was established to annually recognize the achievement and dedicated service of Army National Guard Warrant Officers who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, technical skills, and professionalism in their services to country and community, VING said.
