
Latest Covid Data: 2,322 Active Infections Territory-Wide as 239 New Infections Are Reported

The U.S. Virgin Islands had 2,322 total active Covid-19 infections as of Saturday, with the latest data from the V.I. Dept. of Health showing 239 new cases.

Those numbers are up 83 cases from Friday's 2,239 infections when recovered cases are considered, according to the <u>latest data</u>. The territory's positive rate climbed to 17.21 percent from Friday's 16.89 percent.

St. Croix accounted for 138 of the 229 new cases, carrying the island's total active infections to 1,239. St. Thomas accounted for 80 of the new cases, which brought Charlotte Amalie's total to 922, and St. John accounted for 21 of the new infections, which brought the small island's total active infections to 161.

When new cases are reported and the number of infections are less than the previous day's, it's because the number of individuals listed as recovered by the Dept. of Health in the latest report are more than new infections.

Governor Albert Bryan is expected to host his weekly press briefing on Tuesday following the Martin Luther King. Jr. Day holiday. The administration has extended restrictions implemented just ahead of the new year through Jan. 25, at which point government offices are expected to resume regular in-person office hours, and public school students are scheduled to return to inperson learning.

Those priorities are not expected to change, as cases in the USVI are currently way below the highs of early January, and the Omicron variant of Covid-19, which represents a vast majority of the active infections in the USVI, has proven to be drastically less severe than older variants such as Delta, and is leading to less hospitalizations.
