
Local Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Provides \$5,000 in Scholarship Funding to High School Seniors in St. Thomas and St. John

There are four chapters in the Virgin Islands, two in the St. Thomas-St. John district, Sigma Theta Omega Graduate Chapter and Rho Omicron Undergraduate Chapter at the University of the Virgin Islands. The V.I. chapters are a part of the International Region, which is comprised of all chapter outside of the continental United States including South Africa, Germany, Japan, South Korea, Canada, Liberia, Bermuda, Bahamas, and the United Arab Emirates.
