
Human Services Reopens Richmond Senior Center With Performance From Stanley and the Ten Sleepless Knights

"We are thankful for our local partners who care about our community and especially our senior population," stated Ms. Causey-Gomez. "This shows that our motto, 'Working Together to Make a Difference' truly stands in the U.S. Virgin Islands."

DHS Assistant Commissioner Michal Rhymer-Browne, who has oversight over the Division of Senior Citizens Affairs, welcomed the seniors in attendance back to the facility. "The Department of Human Services, along with our community partners, performed the upgrades to this building so that you can enjoy it in your golden years, because you deserve it," Rhymer-Browne said.

According to the release, the reopening event featured music from Stanley and the Ten Sleepless Knights, DJ music by Darren "Bogle" Stevens, and a dance performance by dance group Kaiso.
