
Carnival Spirit Comes Alive in St. Thomas with Calypso Monarch, Boat Race and Panorama; Machel Montano Performs Tonight

Elsewhere on Sunday, the Carnival Village came alive with Panorama — a festival of steel pan music from various groups playing local and international Soca hits.

An event called Fort Fete, held at Fort Christian on Sunday, kept the atmosphere festive. Such events typically feature Soca artists and deejays.

One of the biggest shows of the weekend was the 2023 Calypso Monarch, and this year's king, who overcame a solid set of competitors, was Richie Buntin.
